1909

Timken Detroit Axle is formed in Detroit, Mich.



1929

Timken Detroit Axle acquires Wisconsin Parts to form Timken Detroit Axle and Wisconsin Axle; Willard Rockwell later becomes president.

1953

Willard Rockwell merges Wisconsin Parts, Standard Steel and Spring and Timken Detroit Axle to form Rockwell Spring and Axle Company.



1975

North American Rockwell merges with Rockwell Manufacturing Co. to form Rockwell International and wins a \$2.6 billion contract to build the space shuttle orbiter designated OV-101.

Automotive operations headquarters is established in Troy, Mich.

1981

Rockwell enters into a joint venture with Iveco to transform the factory in Cameri, Italy from bus assembly to axle manufacturing.

1983

The Cameri plant produces its first axle for the European market.

1987

Rockwell launches two new global axle platforms for on-highway and vocational trucks. The 145 and 160 series are still used today in the marketplace, a testament to their durability and performance.

In the same year the Cameri plant becomes 100 percent Rockwell International.

1997

Rockwell International spins off its automotive business, creating Meritor.

1998

Meritor acquires Volvo Trucks' heavy vehicle manufacturing operation in Lindesberg, Sweden and acquires Euclid Industries, a leading replacement parts manufacturer for heavy-duty vehicles.

In the same year, Meritor acquires LucasVarity's heavy vehicle braking systems business; the company's Cwmbran, United Kingdom facility becomes the worldwide braking center of excellence.

2000

Meritor and Arvin Industries merge to form ArvinMeritor, Inc. (NYSE: ARM)

2007

ArvinMeritor launches the 17X axle in Europe, offering new design features and superior performance for linehaul applications.

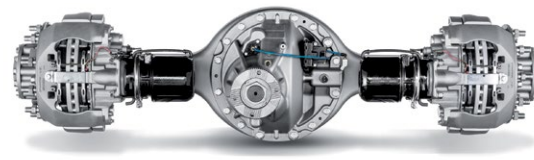
2011

ArvinMeritor completes the divestiture of its light vehicle business in January 2011 and officially changes the name of the company back to Meritor, Inc. (NYSE: MTOR) signifying a dedicated focus on the commercial vehicle and industrial businesses and marking an important evolution in the company's history.



2014

The 17X EVO axle launches in Europe to deliver maximum efficiency and power density.



2017

Meritor acquires the product portfolio and technologies of Fabco Holdings, Inc. and its subsidiaries including GHM Transmissions located in Steyr, Austria.
